Co-President, Shannon Nordlinger, called the meeting to order at 6:37pm. She introduced Melissa Gough as the new Auction Liaison.

Guest Speaker: Elliott Gualtiere, Director of Campus Ministry, said the opening prayer. He gave overview of the Campus Ministry staff as well as the masses, events and retreats that his group is responsible for. Mr. Gualtiere coordinates with Sarah Stanley and Dr. Donna Andrade to coordinate the following:

5 full school masses celebrating the Mass of the Holy Spirit, All Saints, the Immaculate Conception, Ash Wednesday and Ascension. In addition, Bishop Caggiano will be at the Easter mass and 5 students will be confirmed. If any student wants to be confirmed, he can do so through Prep. Other special masses will include the Father-Son Breakfast, the Senior Mom-Son Mass and Baccalaureate. For Thanksgiving there will be a multi-faith prayer service featuring a keynote speaker from the jewish community. Parents are welcome.

Retreats:

Freshman: March 14-15. The entire class is involved. It includes the class service project (Freshman Field Day). 60 upperclassmen will serve as leaders. The retreat rally day was held in October.

Sophomore: Two opportunities are offered on January 23-25 and Apriil 24-26. 20-25 Sophomores will spend two nights at Wisdom House in Litchfield. The theme is Discovery. The group will be led by 6-8 juniors and seniors and 2-3 adults.

Junior/Senior:

Leadership Retreats are typically held in June following exams (could be moved to August this year). Students are recommended to apply by Faculty and Staff. Typically 90-100 are recommended and 20-25 apply (can take more). Open to all grade levels however, it is mostly filled with upperclassmen.

Sr. Movie Retreat February 26-28, Have to have done a retreat at Prep (beyond Freshman Retreat) to be eligible. It requires commitment, prayer and reflection.

Kairos 65: three opportunities each year (November, Jan 29-Feb 1 and April 2-5) very high demand. January is already filled. Includes discussion about the sacraments, prayers and above all, it is a bonding experience.

ND Vision: Summer conference and retreat in South Bend. *All grades are eligible*. Focus is on one's vocational calling in life. It's a co-ed experience and this year, students from Laurelton and Sacred Heart may join the Prep boys. There will be an information session on 11/27 at 7PM.

Information about all retreats and registration materials can be found on the Prep website.

The Campus Ministry Student Group meets on Mondays after school in the chapel The group helps to plan liturgies and events. All students are welcome.

Each class has a Christian Service Requirement:
Freshman will meet the requirement through the March retreat
Sophomores must log 20 hours, Juniors must put in 30 hours and Seniors have a weekly
commitment. Campus ministry is currently testing an app that will help track and approve all
hours with the senior class.

Hours can be completed by participating in one of several service retreats: Urban Plunge is open to Jrs. Typically offered 3x/year. Students will stay at the Catholic Center at St. Charles Borromeo Church in Bridgeport from Thursday to Sunday. They will work with the schools and do things like read to school age children. 15 credit hours after writing a reflection.

Service Immersion for Juniors: Appalachia (June for current sophomores Jamaica (July) Immokalee (February break) Ecuador (April break)

20 credit hours after writing a reflection.

Summer trips through your own church, etc. may be eligible for credit as well.

All opportunities will be presented in Theology class.

Campus Ministry is bringing back the tree lighting ceremony. It will be held the night of the first home basketball game vs. Harding (Monday 12/17 at 6PM). Gifts will be collected for the less fortunate and refreshments will be served. Prep will partner with Harding on this event.

Secretary's Report: Gina Flynn made a motion to approve the October 9, 2018 minutes. Karen Jacobs seconded the motion. All approved.

Presidents' Report: Shannon reminded everyone to 1. go to her or Pasqualina with any questions or problems before approaching Julie and 2. Keep communications in the loop so that information makes it into Prep in a Minute. To be included, all information must be received by Communications on Monday for Friday inclusion.

On 12/12 Shannon and Pasqualina will be hosting a holiday thank-you luncheon for the Bellarmine Guild Board Members.

Enrichment: On behalf of the Enrichment committee, Pasqualina reported that there will be a quick Bellarmine meeting (6-7 pm) before Tracey Fox Speaks on 12/7 from 7-9 pm. The theme of Tracy's presentation will be Happy Self/Happy Holiday and will address de-stressing.

Slide Show: Only 20 photos have been received. Jackie Stead will submit something for Prep in a Minute. She also mentioned that next year's chairs may want to use google drive to collect photos

Nominating: Maureen Sawyer asked everyone to think about what you may want to do next year
