





Jesuits Make

Soccer History



This fall, the Fairfield Prep Varsity soccer team went where no other soccer team in the history of Prep had gone before – the CIAC State Championship. Under the direction of Head Coach **Ryan Lyddy '93**, Prep's 20-3-1 record earned them their 4th consecutive Quinipiac Division Title, 2nd consecutive SCC Conference Title, and a berth in the coveted Class LL State Championship game.

The season began with a trip to Newtown and a rematch of a 2011 LL Second Round game that was won in a penalty kick shootout on the heroic saves of **Jack Grella '12**. While that game ended up a 0-0 tie, Prep then ran up five straight victories against conference opponents, outscoring them during that stretch by a margin of 16-0. **Dave Bigley '13**, a defender turned forward, lead the team with four goals in a five game span. After a trip to Madison against Daniel Hand High School earned the Jesuits their first loss and their first goal allowed, they rebounded with a 3-0 statement victory over rival Xavier High School. After a loss to West Haven, Prep

stormed back and avenged their first loss of the season, defeating Daniel Hand 1-0 on a second half goal by **Chris Molina '16** and stellar goalkeeping against his hometown by **Will Steiner '13**. Prep clinched their fourth consecutive division title with a decisive 5-2 victory at Xavier, led by two goals by **Ryan Orvis '13** and **Austin Sims '14**. Prep ended the regular season with tough road victories at Shelton and Guilford.

Prep earned the #1 seed in the SCC Tournament and a rematch with Shelton. After a back and forth contest, **Darragh Kelly '14** scored in the 77th minute to lead Prep to the semifinals and a third meeting with rival Xavier. Lead by a hard fought effort by **Steve Tortora '14**, Prep advanced to its third straight SCC Championship with a 2-1 victory. In the finals, **Kieran Bracken's '13** first half goal proved to be the difference as Prep captains **Steiner, Davie Bruton '13, Pat Connolly '13** and **Orvis** hoisted the SCC Conference Trophy for the second straight year.

Prep's CIAC LL State Tournament path began with a matchup against crosstown rival Fairfield Ludlowe.



After a scoreless first half, **Molina** scored off a cross to lead Prep to a 1-0 victory. After a 5-0 victory against New Milford High School, Prep was visited by Conard High School. After another scoreless first half, **Tortora** converted on a second half penalty kick and **Sims** scored the game winner with four minutes left in overtime to lead Prep to a 2-1 victory. The Jesuits traveled to New Canaan High School to take on the Greenwich Cardinals in the LL Semifinals. Throughout the game, the Cardinals scoring attempts were stifled at midfield by Prep's defensive unit of **Connolly, Jordan Visosky '13, Kelly** and **Tim Frassetto '13**.

Steiner played the best game of his Prep career at an important time as he made fantastic save after fantastic save. Scoreless after 100 minutes of regulation, **Steiner** lead the Jesuits through two rounds of penalty kick shootouts, stopping three Cardinal attempts and scoring on his own to ignite the Bomb Squad into a frenzy and secure a spot in the State Championship for Prep. In the LL Final, Prep brought all that it had, but came up short against Norwalk High School 2-0.

Jordan Visosky was awarded the team's Most Improved Player. **Austin Sims**, who earned the SCC Final Most Outstanding Player, scored eleven goals during the season to earn a spot on the All-SCC and Connecticut Post All-Star Team. **Pat Connolly**, a

four year varsity player and leader of a defense that let up only sixteen goals in his two years as the starting center back, was named to the All-SCC Team and selected to participate in the CSCA Senior Bowl. **Davie Bruton**, who missed the majority of his junior year with a knee injury, came back impressively with eight goals and five assists to earn a spot on the All-SCC Team, Connecticut Post All-Star Team, New Haven Register All-Area Team, and was selected to participate in the CSCA Senior Bowl.

Will Steiner concluded his illustrious four year career with the Jesuits with two goals scored and 41 career shutouts. He was named the Most Outstanding Player of the SCC Conference Tournament, and earned a spot on the All-SCC Team for the second time. He was named the Connecticut Post All-Star Team for the second straight year, and earned Player of the Year. **Steiner** earned similar honors from the New Haven Register, being named to the All-Area team for the second straight year and also being named as the New Haven Register Most Valuable Player. **Steiner** was selected to participate in the CSCA Senior Bowl and was also awarded as the team's Most Outstanding Player for the second straight year. **Will** was named All-State for the second straight season, was named to the All-New England Team, and for the first time in Prep soccer history, was named an All-American.

Believe! Prep Football








is Back!

A Winning Season

The Prep football team continued to build on success and enjoyed its first winning season since 2007 going 6-4 in the highly competitive Southern Connecticut Conference (SCC). Prep had a fast start of a 5-1 record, with strong victories over Shelton 42-3 and Cheshire 39-6, Prep atypically suffered through turnovers and lost two games before rallying to beat Branford 48-6, and then losing a hard fought game to play-off bound West Haven on Thanksgiving.

Prep's defense led the way this past season and was the top scoring defense in the SCC, and 8th in the state, giving up only 139 points over 10 games. Junior **Nick Crowle** led the defense with 101 tackles and was the Fr. Brissette Defensive Player of the Year. Junior **Tony Fox** and Sophomore **Anthony Palozzolo** each had over 50 tackles. Senior **David Gerics** and sophomore **Colton Smith** led the defensive backfield.

The offense was lead by the Mark Masiello Memorial Offensive Player of the Year, senior **Chris Golger**, 500 rushing yards, 200 receiving yards and 8 TDs and sophomore **John Moten**, 500 rushing yards and 14 TDs. Senior QB **Strecker Backe** won the Chris Boyle Memorial Coaches Award for Perseverance, Loyalty and Determination. He had 800 passing yards and 7 TDs, and 300 rushing yards and 3 TDs. Sophomore **John Dellisante** led all receivers with 18 catches for 270 yards and 3 TDs. The offensive line was led by senior co-captains **Anthony DiLeo** and **John Meyers**. Prep rushed for 230 yards per game and passed for 85 yards per game and scored 309 points.

Post season awards went to **Chris Golger**, **Nick Crowle** and **Anthony Palozzolo**, who each made the first-team ALL-SCC Defense. **Anthony DiLeo** was recognized by the New York Giants and Timex in their *Heart of a Giant* program for his leadership and dedication.

Captains elect for the 2013 season are juniors: **Nick Crowle**, **Tony Fox**, **Anthony Johnson** and **Andrew Ostrowski**.



SENIOR SERVICE

Since my junior year, I have been performing service with the Kids Empowered by Your Support (K.E.Y.S.) organization at the Geraldine Johnson and Columbus elementary schools in Bridgeport. The K.E.Y.S. organization provides extra-curricular music lessons for children in schools where music programs have either been cut back or done away with entirely. I give weekly lessons to students on the instrument of their choosing. My experiences teaching music with K.E.Y.S. have defied my preconceived notions about the power and definition of service and have inspired me to continue this service well outside the bounds of Prep's requirements.

I will admit, initially I joined because it sounded like an easy way to fulfill my junior and senior year service requirements. I did not see how the act of giving free music lessons was service. It was a nice concept, sure, but in my mind music existed as a luxury. To me, service was supposed to be clothing the naked or feeding the hungry. However, my work with K.E.Y.S. has been one of the most meaningful experiences of my life. It has taught me the vital role music and the arts play in the education of a child and the true definition of service.

Many of the children that I encounter come from broken homes. Some do not have parents who emphasize the importance of education or strive to instill in their children a good work ethic and values such as integrity and perseverance. Still others have had great responsibilities thrust on them at unthinkable early ages, with many having to care for their siblings until late in the night or bring home food for their entire family. K.E.Y.S. provides a level of stability and consistency. It creates a safe environment in which they can ask questions, do their homework, and, through the process of learning to play music, develop the important virtues of patience, perseverance, humility, and a sense of self-worth and ability.

Of course, in contemplating my service experience, I may have reaped the greatest benefits of all those impacted by my work. I learned that service, in the truest sense, isn't just about clothing the naked and

feeding the hungry (although it's that too). It is about building relationships with people you otherwise wouldn't encounter. It is about doing this with an eye toward understanding them and their problems. Then you can go out into the world to rectify the injustices that cause them to lack in basic human necessities. It is about being with someone, fully present as one human being to another. It is about listening to their struggles, their joys, their pains, and their stories, and then sharing your own. It is about being a friend, a mentor, an advisor, a teacher, a student, and an advocate.

It is about being Christ for someone and letting them be Christ for you.

URBAN PLUNGE

Thinking back to the variety of experiences and emotions that I felt during the Urban Plunge, I can conclude that the retreat was unforgettable. Not only was it a chance to develop a closer community with my Prep classmates (my other family), but it gave me a tangible understanding of how blessed we really are.

My section worked with the Beardsley School's afterschool program to aid the children. As fun as it was to meet with the zealous kids of Beardsley, I was unaware that this was only the tip of the iceberg, for during the next two days I would be: scaling the tops of clothing and electronics in Connecticut's Quest for Peace, bickering while scouring the lanes of Price Rite for food, and smashing furniture for Habitat for Humanity.

While at CT's Quest for Peace, I recognized for the first time what it meant to be poor. Hanging from the ceiling were portraits of families from Nicaragua living near a junkyard. Not only did they live in an unstable home constructed of the materials from their surroundings, but they survived on food they salvaged from the dump. We



APPALACHIA

“What am I called to do?” I pondered this question on the long car ride down to the Appalachian town of Barren Springs, Virginia. I wanted to change or help them. The funny thing was that the people down there were the ones that changed me.

On the last day of the service trip we went to a park that had water slides, a pool, and plenty of games. This was all thanks to Sam Crawford who was in charge of this neighbor-to-neighbor

organization and took care of us that week. While we were swimming, a woman asked us to watch her water noodles while she went to get her kids — so we did. She returned with new water guns, more than enough for fifteen kids. She just gave them to us saying, “Here, they’re yours.” Just like that — a complete stranger bought us a gift!

There are many wealthier communities where it would never occur to anyone to do such an act of kindness. But that was the type of behavior we often witnessed there.

I am not the first Prep student to come back with this revelation. Our senior leaders who went to Appalachia last year tried to explain it to us, but

personal growth is just that. You have to go through the process and experience it first hand to receive the gift of knowledge that kindness, caring, and community, can come from the most surprising and unexpected places. The takeaway is you don’t have to go to Appalachia or El Salvador. You can choose to have this experience in the next town or your own community. Take advantage of Prep’s opportunities or create your own. Either way, the effort you extend will double in return and maybe you will find your calling.

were told of two brothers who never attended school at the same time. When one was in school, the other was home. When the teacher sought a reason for their absences, he learned that they only had one pair of pants to share. Whoever had the pants would be the one to go to school. I was awestruck. I can come home to a warm meal and gadgets of entertainment, while not even recognizing those who have nothing and sometimes even forgetting to thank the hands that made the meal! There are so many things that we often take for granted, as if we are entitled to receive them. However, the truth is we did nothing different than that family who struggles to survive in a junkyard.

Both within the sanctity of St. Charles’ Urban Center and outside in Bridgeport’s East Side, I believe that the experiences I encountered helped me grow as a person. The plunge opened my eyes to the cruel reality and instability of the world. It taught me that the poor have little to nothing and despite their efforts, it becomes nearly impossible to rid themselves of their burden of need and reliance. Although the affluent consist of the smallest percentage of the world’s population, they have all the power and essentially decide who survives in this



“dog eat dog” world.

However, I learned that it doesn’t have to be this way. By society’s standards I, like most individuals, am nowhere near what people would consider wealthy. Yet, the experience allowed me to realize that I am affluent in my own way for: I have a roof over my head every night, I am receiving a phenomenal education, and I’ve never wondered if the meal I had last would be my last. This leads me to ask: If those who are “better-off” in our world could sacrifice some of their desires, possessions, or time to donate and aid to those who rarely have their needs met, then wouldn’t the world be a wonderful place? Yet, the following question becomes: Can I (or we) be satisfied with a little less so that the less fortunate can have a little more? After all the experiences I encountered in the Urban Plunge, I hope to never forget the poor,

the sick, or the hungry in the world. Regardless of the profession I decide to partake in I want to find some way for it to benefit the poor and humanity as a whole. It is as a result of this retreat that I caught a glimpse of what it truly means to be “a man for others.”

It is important to understand that we should, by no means, feel guilty about what we have. Instead, we should be happy and grateful for all the blessings that we’ve received over the course of our lives. We have been blessed with great minds, compassionate hearts, and the chance to become the next generation of leaders in a great nation. After participating in the distribution of clothing in CT’s Quest for Peace and rearranging miscellaneous furniture for Habitat for Humanity, I learned that not only are there many people in the world who require aid but that one person alone can easily make a difference in another’s life. It all begins with the realization of who you are and the understanding of what you have.

Hearthstone 2012 Yearbook wins First Place




We were extremely pleased with our experience. Our son has not stopped talking about it!!

We really enjoyed seeing ALL the students in the hallways. It gave us a great feel for the student body. Also loved the band playing.






Thunder and Lightning







Pax Christi awarded to Prep senior

David Maloof II, a senior at Fairfield Prep and a member of St. John Parish in Darien, has been awarded the Eileen Egan Peacemaker Award from Pax Christi. David received the prestigious award for his work in helping to create a basketball facility at a Palestinian Christian refugee camp in Beirut, Lebanon.

Pax Christi (the words are Latin for “the peace of Christ”) is a global Catholic peace movement, with branches in more than fifty countries. The United States branch has its headquarters in New York City. Nationally-renowned winners of Pax Christi Peacemaker Awards have included actor Martin Sheen, whose passion for social justice comes from his Catholic faith; the celebrated Jesuit priest author and peace activist, Fr. John Dear, S.J., who has also been nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize; and Sr. Helen Prejean, America’s leading advocate for the abolition of the death penalty.

The award was based on David’s efforts, over the past several years, to create a basketball court and add a ping pong table to the refugee camp. Before that, the only sports outlet for children in the camp was a dirt soccer field. This past summer, at the request of camp leaders, he returned with his father to run a basketball clinic for children at the camp.

David’s understanding of the importance of service is woven throughout his life. It began in his early years at St. Aloysius School in New Canaan and was fostered by the attitudes and activities of his



family, who have always been active in parish and community projects to help the less fortunate. That understanding has matured at Prep, where a focus on Ignatian Spirituality aims to lead each student to become “a man for others.”

“We want the guys to develop a mature theological approach to social justice,” says Matt Tellis, who teaches theology to juniors and seniors at Prep. “We want them to figure out what their values are and how that impacts their lives.”

David’s journey to Lebanon and ultimately, to the Pax Christi award began when his father (also named David) became interested in tracing the family’s roots. David’s great-grandfather had come to America in an early wave of Lebanese immigration, arriving here in 1914. His father made contact with some cousins still living in Lebanon and arranged for a visit. At that time David was still in middle school.

“My dad felt that, with so many issues going on in the country, going just to the tourist part wouldn’t

help us understand the country,” he explains. So the elder Maloof contacted the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, a papal agency for humanitarian and pastoral support. They put together a tour that included the country’s tourist attractions and locations that highlighted tensions in Lebanon and throughout the Middle East, including the Dbayeh camp for Christian refugees located outside Beirut. The injustice implicit in the camp’s existence was an eye-opener.

“They’re called refugees, but the Christian Palestinians have been there for about 80 years,” David explains. “The Lebanese have ruled that they can live in these camps, but they can’t become Lebanese citizens. They can’t build roofs on their houses, because under Lebanese law a roof would make them permanent residences.” They can have a piece of tin over the top to keep out the rain, but that’s all.

David points out that he grew up in a generation that has seen practically everything, thanks to streaming video, the Internet and YouTube. Even so, “to meet people, to put myself in their position, to reflect that this would be your entire life, with very few opportunities for anything different—they can’t become doctors or lawyers. Even registering to create a business or get a drivers’ license is very difficult for them.”

Ignatian spirituality is sometimes referred to as the “spirituality for decision makers.” David couldn’t change Middle East politics, but in conversations with camp directors he learned that American basketball

was becoming an international sport and was gaining a following in Lebanon. This was something he could work with.

With the help of a Garage Sale at St. John’s, and two New Year’s Day Polar Bear Swims in Newport, RI (for one, David and his sister, Julia, did the swim as Power Rangers; this year he and his uncle did it as Batman and Robin), David raised enough funds to build a basketball hoop at the camp and supply the kids with basketballs, with money left over for a ping pong table and equipment.

David’s contribution snowballed. The Italian Embassy had volunteered to build a water tower for the camp. When they saw the kids playing basketball, they pitched in to finish an entire basketball court. “It looks like a full court in the U.S.,” David says.

This year camp officials invited David and his dad back to run a basketball clinic. Although his sport of choice at Prep is wrestling, David had played basketball at St. Aloysius, and plays at the YMCA in Darien. “We set up three teams, taught them defensive drills, had them practice free throws and run layup lines,” he explains.

Corey Dennis, a theology teacher at Prep and David’s wrestling coach, has known him well over his years at the school and is proud of his efforts to help the youngsters the Dbayeh camp. “Dave doesn’t see this as service, he sees this as justice,” he says.

In the interest of making his contribution more consistent in the future, David will be contacting universities in Beirut in the hope of getting student volunteers interested in continuing the basketball clinics. The family hopes to return to Lebanon in 2014.

David will be headed for Columbia University in New York this fall. He would like to study international politics, with an eye to working in the State Department or the U.N. “Your whole life should be about helping others—it’s not something you do on weekends,” he says. “It started with my family, and Prep has really clarified this for me.”

David, along with other winners, will be presented with the Pax Christi award at a formal ceremony in the Spring.

The Charitable IRA is back!

Congress recently passed legislation to extend the Charitable IRA Rollover. The law allows individuals who are 70½ and older to make special gifts to charities, such as Fairfield Prep, from their IRA.

How does the Charitable IRA Rollover work?

Taxpayers age 70½ and older are required to make annual distributions from their retirement accounts. The distributions are included in the taxpayers' adjusted gross income (AGI), and taxpayers pay taxes on them. The Charitable IRA Rollover permits taxpayers to make donations directly to charitable organizations, such as Fairfield Prep, from their IRA's without counting them as part of their AGI and, consequently, without paying taxes on them.




Game raises funds for Coach Bob Hurley and St. Anthony High School

Dr. Chuck McCullough '47 – A Steward for Fairfield Prep



“Large, witty, amiable Chuck. . . enlivens any situation with his ready wit. . . busy reducing Fairfield’s canine population with Syd’s truck. . . slinks after teachers with a camera. . . popular because pleasant and good natured. . . hopes to enter the medical field”

— From the 1947 Hearthstone

The descriptive words above, taken from the class of 1947 yearbook, are next to the senior photo of Charles Discant McCullough. Born in Bridgeport on December 20, 1929, Chuck passed away on December 20, 2010. During his 81 years of living Chuck was also described as friendly, caring, and loyal. He was especially loyal to Fairfield Prep.

When Chuck entered in 1943, Fairfield Prep had been open for one year. There was no guarantee that the school would survive, flourish, and celebrate its 70th anniversary in 2012. Classes were held in McAuliffe Hall, and Berchmans and Xavier Halls were on the drawing board. Parents, through tuition payments and private gifts, provided the primary financial support. Over time this began to change as the alumni body grew and became successful. Dr. McCullough initially demonstrated his stewardship by making a gift to Prep's Annual Fund. Later, he included Fairfield Prep in his estate planning.

Dr. Charles McCullough certainly took his stewardship of Fairfield Prep very seriously. He wanted to make sure that what Prep had done for him, it could continue to do for others. He bequeathed a portion of his estate to our school; his simple act has touched Fairfield Prep forever.

Reasons for making a bequest to a charitable institution such as Prep vary. Some are motivated by a desire to honor a loved one, others want to take advantage of existing tax laws, still others want to be remembered. Regardless of motive, a bequest is not made lightly. A will is one of the most important documents we ever prepare. Constructed carefully, it can be a powerful declaration of the love and concern for people and institutions we care about the most. Making a bequest is one of the noblest acts of stewardship.

Generally bequests fall into four categories:

Specific Dollar Amount: I give the sum of \$ _____ to Fairfield College Preparatory School

Percentage: I give _____ % of my estate to Fairfield College Preparatory School

Residual: After all estate expenses and all beneficiary bequests are satisfied, I bequeath the remainder of my estate to Fairfield College Preparatory School.


Contingency: In the event that all of my heirs predecease me, I bequeath all of my estate to Fairfield College Preparatory School.

GUIDANCE: Prep's X-Factor

An appropriate college choice for all students is an essential outcome of our four year Guidance program. Our ultimate goal is to assist in the development of a young man who seeks growth and is well prepared for the academic and personal challenges of college. This goal is achieved as a natural outcome of the many activities and challenges engaged by our students in and out of the classroom which are supported by the efforts of the Guidance Department. The specific college guidance activities and the resulting choices our students achieve are in fact the capstone of our program, founded on a four year series of counseling activities which begin as our students transition from middle school to Fairfield Prep.

The Guidance office at Fairfield Prep is a busy place. Every day you will find any number of students meeting with their counselors discussing topics ranging from transitioning to Prep to managing stress, from course selection each year to college selection in senior year. Although many of our daily activities are not directly related to the college process, all are designed to promote positive personal and academic growth which will prepare our students for their college related activities.

Our goals have not changed but our procedures have. A key vehicle in our college guidance program is the Naviance program. It is a web-based program introduced to all students in freshman year through which information is shared

among student, parent and counselor. Students grow with it as it guides and tracks their academic and personal growth readying them for the specific college selection and application activities of junior and senior years.

Using the many facets of the program our students engage in self-discovery as they complete the personality type assessment and career interest profiler in sophomore year. Information generated from each of these activities is archived to assist students in considering future choices regarding college and career.

Students complete "Game Plan" and "Resume" activities which are steps designed to lead them to the online college investigation features of Naviance. Each year student grade point averages are updated and when taken, PSAT scores and ACT Plan scores are uploaded to continue shaping each student's profile. SAT and/or ACT scores will eventually become part of each student's profile as well. As a student's profile builds, Naviance becomes more valuable in assisting with college search activities.

After an initial search Naviance will match students with colleges by academic numbers and by program interest, preparing the way for campus visits. "Scattergrams" provide predictive information based on the outcomes of Prep students who have applied to colleges over the previous three years. Prep's acceptance history at colleges is also available and Naviance allows a


student to set up a "college compare" chart. These activities are introduced to students in our seminars and group settings. The results are discussed with students in one-to-one meetings.

Results generated by these many activities provide a solid basis for conversations in our offices as well as at home where strategies are discussed and ultimate decisions are made. When seniors apply to colleges, all application data is tracked and all documents sent electronically through Naviance. All student results are archived yearly to assist each rising class in their college investigations. The greater availability of information has led to richer conversations with students, improved planning procedures and to a more informed college advising program.

The particular mission of Prep's counselors is to accompany students on their personal journeys assisting the transition from each year to the next. We seek to open windows to the possibilities which lay ahead, identifying the steps needed to access those possibilities and to encourage self-discovery through the process. We offer our students a listening ear and steadying hand. A well-formed young man is the goal and a successful student with solid goals and appropriate college acceptances is the result.



Stand & Deliver

At first glance, the James J. Curiale School in Bridgeport seems a world away from Fairfield Prep. In reality, the elementary school on Bridgeport's West Side is less than five miles from Prep's campus.

In the school, the scene is instantly familiar, with Prep graduates **Brett Gustafson**, **Michael Scarpetti**, **Michael Jones** and **Greg Pacific** discussing academics, while occasionally remarking on Prep hockey, their favorite teachers and the Jesuit ideal of being "men for others," especially as it relates to their work.

Curiale sits in one of the city's poorest neighborhoods and the students have been chronic underperformers for years, prompting the state to give the school extra attention. Part of that attention was its inclusion in the Commissioner's Network, a 3-year pilot program that includes \$1 million in additional funds each year. The program also allowed the school to extend its instructional day, add five days to the school year and hire a new principal with a specific mission to turn the school around.

Brett Gustafson '88, is the top man at Curiale. He previously had spent eight years at PS1 in Manhattan's Lower East Side in the Chinatown neighborhood.

"PS1 had some of the same challenges as Curiale, but it was definitely different," Gustafson said. "We had a lot of problems with poverty and language difficulty, but there weren't the discipline problems there that we have here."

Walking the halls of Curiale, it

is clear that Gustafson is in charge. Hardly pausing in speaking about his plans for the school, Gustafson breaks up a group of loitering students, confiscates another's baseball cap and exhorts **Jones '03**, to keep his students together as they head to the cafeteria. Jones said Gustafson's influence on the school was clear already.

"The difference between last year and this year is night-and-day," Jones said. "We know that there are expectations for the students, and us, and that we will be held accountable. But there is also the sense of support and follow-through. If we need something to help our students, we get it."

Scarpetti '83, a 22-year veteran at the school, agreed.

"Where the head goes, the body goes," he said. "Now that we are being led in the right direction, the staff believes in what we are doing. When your leader works his tail off for you and the students, it makes you want to work harder."

Pacific '00, cited the sense of calm, determination and structure as key to the school's future.

"It's much easier for us to teach knowing that we have the support of the administration," he said. "If we have a problem with a student, we know our leaders support us."

Gustafson said his journey to Curiale began with his service project at Prep, when he spent time at Bridgeport's Boys & Girls Club.

"It made me realize I could make a difference to kids," he said. "I didn't really understand it at the time, but it was the beginning of me choosing education as my career."

Gustafson's changes at Curiale began before the first student filed in back in September. The interior walls, tattered and dingy with 28 years of accumulated grime, got a thorough cleaning and many were repainted. Broken tiles were replaced and graffiti scrubbed off the building.

"Right away we sent the message that things are different, the things that used to be tolerated would not be anymore," Gustafson said.

Naturally there was some pushback; mostly from the seventh and eighth grade students who had been allowed to do what they wanted when they wanted since they were kindergartners, Gustafson said.

"To succeed in life, they need to learn that actions have consequences, but also that there are positive benefits for positive actions," he said.

Since September, the efforts of the staff have begun to pay off. The teachers reported fewer disciplinary problems and fewer students in detention. With teachers spending less time disciplining, there is more time for instruction, which is good because ultimately test scores judge the school and staff. Curiale is among the lowest-performing schools in the state, but the staff is determined to change that.

"None of us have to be here, we could have taken jobs in other districts with fewer challenges," Scarpetti said. "We're here to make a difference."



first two weeks led to a home meet against Amity, a team that was also undefeated since 2010. Without **Alvarado** everyone would have to run their best to even make it close. Sophomore **Andy Thane** led the way for an exciting Prep victory 28-29.

The following week **Alvarado's** absence could not be covered by other members of the team and the team finished the dual meet season 10-1 when we lost to rival Xavier on Hamden's home course. **Alvarado** returned to run at the SCC Championship where he ran away from the lead pack at the 2 mile mark to become conference champion. **Andy Thane** and **James Mulliken** finished 11th and 12th and were named to the all-SCC team.

At the Class LL meet the decision was made to rest **Alvarado** and let the rest of the team earn the right to advance to the State Open. The long term goal was to finish in the top six at the Open in order to qualify as a team for the New England Championships. The team ran to 8th place and successfully qualified.

The next week, with the team back at full strength, the prospects for advancing to the New England's looked good, a top 6 finish well within reach. With a half mile left to go **Alvarado** was in 6th place and moved up to finish 4th at the end. All other runners were in position except **Alec Hilton**. **Alec** had been knocked down less than a quarter mile into the race and was well back of his normal finish position. It turns out he had suffered a broken tibia and somehow managed to run the full race anyway. However the team finished 7th, missing the New England's by a spot. **Christian Alvarado** did advance as an individual and made

the trip to Maine where he finished 9th and earned all-New England honors.

Mid-November brought the Jesuit High School Championships at Van Cortlandt Park in New York City. The team finished 3rd and **Alvarado** ran especially well to win individual first place. This set up the following week's attempt to qualify for the Footlocker National Cross Country Championships by running again at Van Cortlandt Park. The top ten runners in each of four regional races across the U.S. would earn an all expense paid trip to San Diego in early December to compete with the best of the best. **Alvarado** ran a smart, well paced race to finish 8th in the Northeast Regional (Washington D.C. north to Maine) and two weeks later he headed off across the country with Coaches Ford Jr. and Ford Sr.

In San Diego the 40 best girl and boy cross country runners are treated to an all-star weekend at the Del Coronado Hotel by the Footlocker Company and ASICS Shoes. The race at San Diego's Balboa Park was very fast paced — **Christian** ultimately finished 39th having some problems with his injured foot, but was pleased overall to have made it to Nationals.

A top ten Connecticut team all season long the Cross Country team had a successful season. **Christian Alvarado** has been nominated as the Gatorade Runner of the Year for Connecticut and was selected as a Connecticut Post All-Star and as MVP of the New Haven Register's All-Area Cross Country Team. He will return for his senior year in Cross Country as the pre-season top runner in the state and as a runner-to-watch nationally. With six of our best seven runners returning for next year, our sights are on returning to the state championship podium in 2013.

Craig Kinsley '07 is Fairfield Sportsperson of the Year

At the Annual Sports Night sponsored by the Fairfield County Sports Commission on October 15, **Craig Kinsley '07** was awarded the 2012 Sportsperson of the Year Award, which was accepted by his former Prep track and field coach Dave Driscoll.

Kinsley was a javelin thrower for the United States Track and Field Team at the 2012 London Summer Olympics. Kinsley, 23, had his best throw of 78.18 meters in the third and final throw in the javelin preliminary round. That placed him 10th in Group B and was the longest throw of any American. Unfortunately, it did not qualify him for the next round, and he placed 23rd overall.

Prep participates in International Colloquium

On July 29, 2012 more than 375 educators from 280 Jesuit institutions in 62 countries gathered at Boston College for the International Colloquium on Jesuit Secondary Education. Dr. Robert A. Perrotta, Principal of Fairfield Prep, and **Gregory H. Marshall '73**, Dean of Enrollment & Marketing, represented Prep at this event, the first of its kind.

The event marked the culmination of several years of effort by Boston College High School, which first conceived of the Colloquium as a step towards fulfillment of Decree 2.20 of General Congregation 35 of the Society of Jesus, which sets forth the Society's interest in having its various ministries, including education, work together across international boundaries. The Colloquium's theme, "The World Is Our House," succinctly articulated the principle that



Jesuit education is effectuated worldwide by one global family of educators, linked by their devotion to the common mission.

Presentations, workshops and informal gatherings were held that week until the Colloquium was adjourned on

Thursday, August 2. During the Colloquium, delegates from Jesuit schools in Europe, Asia, Africa, Oceania and the Americas reaped the benefits of the unprecedented opportunity the gathering presented for international sharing of knowledge and experiences. There was also time built in for sightseeing in Boston, which most delegates had never before visited.

Presentations were simultaneously interpreted into the Colloquium's three official languages: English, French and Spanish. A wireless internal broadcasting system utilizing headphones allowed Colloquium participants to choose which of the three languages they preferred for optimum comprehension of each presentation. While most workshops were conducted in English, several were presented in French and several in Spanish. Conversations in any language could be heard at the several informal gatherings held throughout the week.

Participants learned that superficial differences notwithstanding, all Jesuit schools share the underlying mission of spreading the Gospel and educating men and women for others in order that Christ's work continue throughout the world.

At Fairfield Prep's beginning-of-the-year faculty meeting in August, Dr. Perrotta provided the Prep faculty with a summary of the Colloquium.

Russell Neary '75 Killed In Superstorm Sandy

Russell Neary '75 became the first Easton firefighter to die during the line of duty. Russell Neary worked for 33 years at General Re in Stamford. His heart, however, was always centered on his family and his community. The Easton volunteer fireman died October 29 while on a call at the height of Superstorm Sandy.

"We used to kid him that General Re was just a hobby for him," said Roy Hornbeck, who worked with Neary for 22 years and was his manager and close friend. "The firehouse was his career. Between that and being with his family, that's what he loved to do more than anything."

Neary, 55, died when he was hit by a falling limb while answering a fire call at about 7:45 p.m. Neary was a lieutenant with the Easton Fire Department. His was the first death on the Easton force. He is survived by his wife, Mary Anne, and two daughters.

Neary graduated from Fairfield Prep and Holy Cross. He was also a soccer coach, president of the Easton Fire Department and an MRT with Easton EMS. His brother, **Peter '77**, is the Easton fire marshal. Neary had been a member of the Easton Fire Department for more than 10 years. Neary was a vice president at General Re as an underwriter in the Global Ocean Marine division.
