You should complete the following tasks as you prepare to begin AP Latin in August:

- 1. Work on vocabulary acquisition using this website's Vocabulary Exercises for review: http://www.tabney.com/aeneid.html
- 2. Review the Aeneid, Book 1 (Latin: 1-209, 418-440, 494-578; English: 210-417, 441- 493, 579-756).
- 3. Read the entire Aeneid in English. W.F. Jackson Knight's translation is recommended because it is written in prose. Here is a good online version: https://www.poetryintranslation.com/PITBR/Latin/Virgilhome.php

You are expected to know the WHOLE STORY in all 12 books, not just the smaller excerpts that are translated from the Latin.

As you read, make not of the significant events in each book. This will make your review of English sections easier during the year.
